

Information according to Article 13 EU-GDPR

In the following we would like to comply with the information obligation in accordance to Article 13 GDPR.

1. Which data / data types are specifically affected?

Name of the reporting person as well as e-mail address and name of the according department are affected only.

2. Processing purposes

The data is collected and processed for the purpose of simple and low-threshold contact as long as the reader is interested in participating in the according study.

A study is presented on the regarding website. If interested readers are able to use a online contact form (UKM domain, hosted via a UKM server) to register and submit their name, email address and department. This contact option must not use patients. It is directed at potential study centers, which may use this contact form to express their interest in participating in the regarding study. The form is used to simplify feedback.

3. Legal basis for processing

The legal basis for processing the mentioned personal data is Art. 6 Para. 1-f GDPR.

The person responsible has a legitimate interest in answering the contact form. The mentioned information (name, email address and department) is revealed exclusively on a voluntary basis, i.e. the decision to use the contact form is up to the reader.

The use of this contact form is not mandatory. Alternatively, the reader is able to contact the Bureau of Clinical Investigations of the Department for Anesthesiology,

Intensive Care and Pain Medicine via the contact addresses given on the website (electronic, written, telephone) or withdraw from contact if they are not interested.

4. Receiver

The previously mentioned, voluntarily provided information is forwarded internally to the Bureau of Clinical Investigations of the Department for Anesthesiology, Intensive Care and Pain Medicine, so that the according staff can contact the reporting person.

5. Duration of storage

The contact details are stored for the duration of the study (here: EPIS-AKI). If the study center participates in the study, the data is archived for 10 years in accordance to Good Clinical Practice (GCP).

After this time, the data will be destroyed in accordance to data protection. If the reader does not participate in the study, the submitted contact details will be deleted immediately after rejection. The data is not forwarded or processed.
