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

Dear colleagues, Dear friends,

we are pleased to invite you to the third French/ German meeting on T-cell lymphoma in Münster! After the first meeting held in Aachen in 2012 and the second meeting in Bordeaux in 2014 a number of studies were launched and successfully published. After more than 10 years, the field has been rapidly changing, and in a rare disease like T-cell lymphoma, we believe that close cooperation is more important than ever to speed up progress in understanding and treating the ever increasing number of T-cell entities. Therefore, the working groups of the French Lymphoma Study Association LYSA and the German Lymphoma Alliance GLA dealing with T-cell lymphoma decided to convene another bilateral meeting aiming at deepening and intensifying our cooperation.
